

Picture Puzzles Scavenger Hunt Organization Template

Please note that this document works with our Picture Puzzles video - be sure to check out our Youtube video for more information!

We have provided 2 different organization methods for creating the scavenger hunt - one develops all the clues one step at a time, while the other develops the clues one at a time. Use whatever method appeals to you! First we explain how to use the tables for both methods, then the tables are attached below. We have provided space for a 25 piece puzzle, but it's not necessary to create such an extensive scavenger hunt! Feel free to print what you need rather than this entire document! Tables start on page 3.

Method One: Developing the Clues One Step at a Time

This method uses 3 tables to develop your scavenger hunt. This method is good if developing this scavenger seems confusing because you'll be putting all your information together at the end, rather than all at once. The tables for Method One are Pages 3-6.

Table One:

This table is for listing all of the hiding places for your puzzle pieces. List out anywhere from 2-4 place options for each puzzle piece. Next, select the actual hiding spots for the pieces. The puzzle piece will be hidden in one location, while the other listed locations are for the 'wrong answer options'. Mark your choices with a highlighter or by circling the locations so you remember! Don't cross out the locations you aren't using because you will use these later!

Table Two:

This table is for creating questions and answers. The number of answers is the same as the number of places you listed for each piece. If you gave each puzzle piece 4 place options, give 4 answers.

1: What is my favorite color?

Table Three:

This table uses the information from the other two tables to create your scavenger hunt. In the first column, list out how many puzzle pieces you have. Next, list your questions. A few examples have been provided. List the correct answer from Table Two, and the corresponding location from Table One. This table doesn't include space for the wrong answers, so you will have to refer to your other tables for that information!

Piece #	Question	Correct Answer	Next Piece's Location
1	What is my favorite color?	green	by the coffee pot
2	$2 \times 2 =$	4	under the barstool
3	What day is Valentine's Day?	February 14th	on the guest room bed

Method Two: Developing the Clues One at a Time

If using three tables is confusing or inconvenient for you, we also have an all-in-one table! This method develops all the steps at once, which means you'll be planning out each clue at a time rather than each step individually. The table for Method Two is Pages 7-9.

Table Four:

This table has all your information in one place which makes it very easy to keep track of all the steps! First fill out the long row with your question, and 2-4 answer options. Next, include the corresponding locations for your answer choices. Lastly, fill in the farthest right column with the location of the next puzzle piece. This makes it easy to track where you are hiding your pieces! I've highlighted the correct answers in green/yellow. The highlighting on Question 1 corresponds with Method One's highlighting to show how the information is displayed.
